It is a web-based comprehensive telemedicine solution.

Aim— It aims to make healthcare services equitable by bridging the digital divide that exists in both rural areas and isolated communities.

Types of telemedicine services-This eSanjeevani platform has enabled two types of telemedicine services viz. Doctor-to-Doctor (eSanjeevani) and Patient-to-Doctor (eSanjeevani OPD) Teleconsultations.

The former is being implemented under the Ayushman Bharat Health and Wellness Centre (AB-HWCs) programme.

Benefits- It has made it convenient for people to avail health services without travel.

It can also be used to provide medical education to interns, people across Various Common Service Centers (CSCs), etc.



Green Hydrogen Policy

Government of India unveiled its New Green Policy Hydrogen under National Hydrogen Mission. The mission aims to aid the government in meeting its climate target and making India a green hydrogen hub. There is an increased consensus around the world that concerted steps need to be taken to reduce global warm-ing to levels less than 20 C and if possible, to cap it at 1.50 C higher than preindustrial levels. Transition to Green Hydrogen and Green Ammonia is one of the major requirements for the reduction of emissions. Hydrogen as an energy carrier has a vital role in the diversification of renewable energy across key economic sectors, by increasing the share of renewable energy in the electricity mix, enabling clean transportation, and decarbonizing industries like fertilizers. chemicals. petrochemicals, iron, steel.

Tips of the Month



AYUSH <u>(Indian Traditional</u> medicines)

Diet plays very important role in our physical and mental health status. Many common health problems can be pre-vented or treated by consumption of a good diet. The fol-lowing need to be followed.Wash vegetables fruits properly before cooking.Use boiling, steaming, grilling etc. as methods cooking.Whole wheat flour (without sieving) may be prepared for making roti. Roti made out of jowar, bajra, ragi, maize (macca) are also having high fibre content. The use of white bread, nan, roomali roti and other maida prepara-tions should be limited.It is desirable to take 50-100 gms/day fibre, when whole grain cereals, pulses and vegetables are consumed daily. It is for our advantage to maintain our traditional cooking patterns.Increase eating locally available seasonal fruits and green leafy vegetables in the diet. As far as possible eat freshly prepared food. Reheating and refrigerating tends to lose the taste and nourishment.

YOGASANAS



TADASANA (Palm Tree Posture)

Tada means palm tree or mountain. This asana one teaches to attain stability and firmness and forms the base for all the standing asana. Technique: (i) Stand with feet 2 inches apart (ii) Interlock the fingers, and turn the wrist outwards. Inhale, raise and arms up above the head. Raise the heels off the floor and blanace on the toes as one can raise his or her arms. Stay in the position for 10-30 seconds. Bring the heel down. Exhale, release the interlock of the fingers and bring the arm down and come back to standing posture. Benefits: This asana brings stability in the body, helps to clear up congestion of the spinal nerves and corrects faulty posture. Help to increase height up to a certain age.



The building is composed of 27 free-standing marble-clad "petals" arranged in clusters of three to form nine sides.



Festivals



Puthandu, also known as Puthuvarudam, Tamil New Year, is the first day of year on the Tamil calendar and traditionally celebrated as a festival. The festival date is set with the solar cycle of the lunisolar Hindu calendar, as the first day of the Tamil month Chithirai. It falls on or about 14 April every year on the Gregorian calendar. The same day is observed elsewhere in South and South East Asia as the traditional new year.



PALAK PANEER

Palak paneer is a vegetarian dish, consisting of paneer in a thick paste made from puréed spinach, called palak in Hindi, Marathi, Gujarati, and other Indian languages. The terms palak paneer and saag paneer are sometimes used interchangeably in restaurants in the Anglosphere. However, saag paneer is different from traditional palak paneer in that it contains other green leafy vegetables, such as mustard greens, whereas palak paneer only contains spinach.

INGREDIENTS

- 350 grams spinach
- □ 1 medium tomato
- 5 large garlic cloves divided,3 whole and 2 finely chopped
- ② 1 inch ginger
- ② 1 green chili or more to taste
- 2 1 tablespoon oil 15 ml, I used avocado oil
- 1 large onion finely chopped

- 1/4 teaspoon turmeric powder1/4 teaspoon red chili powder
- or to taste salt to taste
- 2-3 tablespoons heavy cream or adjust to taste
- 225 grams paneer cut into cubes
- 1/2 tablespoon kasuri methi crushed, dried fenugreek leaves
- lemon juice to taste

PREPARATION

- Boil spinach leaves for 2 to 3 minutes until wilted.
- Strain and blender the blanched spinach along with tomato, 3 cloves of garlic, ginger and green chili. Puree to a smooth paste and set aside.
- Heat a pan on medium heat. Once hot, add the oil and then add the remaining 2 cloves of chopped garlic. Sauté for few minutes until it starts changing color.
- Then add the chopped onions. Cook the onion for 2 to 3 minutes until soft and translucent.
- Add in the prepared spinach puree, some water. and Let the mixture cook for 10 minutes on medium heat.
- Once the spinach is cooked, add the garam masala, turmeric powder, red chilli powder and salt. Mix and cook for 1 minute.
- Then add the heavy cream and mix.
- Stir in the paneer and mix. Let the curry simmer for 3 to 4 minutes. Add lemon juice and kasuri methi and mix.
- Serve palak paneer hot with naan or roti or rice.
