## Soil Health Card Scheme

Soil Health Card Scheme was launched in 2015 in Rajasthan. India by the Ministry Agriculture and Farmers Welfare. The card informs farmers about nutrients status of the soils along with the recommendation on appropriate dosage of nutrients to improve soil health and fertility. The card will be issued once in every 3 years to a farmer so that nutrients deficiency can regularly detected and improved. The Government of India has updated the funding pattern for health soil card scheme implemented by the Ministry of Agriculture under National for Mission Sustainable Agriculture. Accordingly, fund sharing pattern would be 90:10 for North Eastern and Himalayan States and 60:40 for other states and 100% borne by central government in Union Territories.

## **INS Vikrant**

Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Mr. Narendra Modi, commissioned the first indigenously designed and built aircraft carrier as INS Vikrant. Designed by Indian Navy's in-house Warship Design Bureau (WDB) and built by Cochin Shipyard Limited, a Public Sector Shipvard under the Ministry Ports, Shipping Waterways, Vikrant has been built with with state of the art automation features and is the largest ship ever built in maritime history of India. The Indigenous Aircraft Carrier is named after her illustrious predecessor, India's Aircraft Carrier which had played a vital role in the 1971 war. It has a large number of indigenous equipment and machinery, involving major industrial houses in the country as well as over 100 MSMEs. With the commissioning of **INS** Vikrant, India will have two operational Aircraft Carriers, bolster which will the maritime security of the nation.



## UNSUNG FREEDOM FIGHTER OF INDIA

Pandyanda I Belliappa was prominent freedom fighter from the Kodagu district of Karnataka. He was one of the earliest people from Kodagu to join the Congress in 1920 and one of the first to court arrest from Kodagu during the Freedom Movement. From 1924, Belliappa served on both the Legislative Council Legislative the and Assembly of Kodagu. He played an instrumental role in Gandhian movements such as the Salt Satyagraha, Individual Satyagraha, and the Quit Movement. The India famous visit of Mahatma Gandhi to Kodagu in 1934 is a crucial episode in the story of Kodagu's freedom struggle. Gandhi's visit was largely possible due to the efforts of Belliappa, who accompanied Gandhi throughout his stay there. Belliappa's sacrifice and selfless service are hailed even today in India.

## **Prachand**

Hon'ble Defence Minister of India, Mr. Rajnath Singh, formally inducted the first indigenouslybatch of developed Light Combat Helicopter (LCH) into the Indian Air Force. The twinengine helicopter – which is officially named Prachand has been designed and developed by Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL), is a 5.8 class dedicated tonne combat helicopter. LCH is the only attack helicopter in the world which can land and take off at an altitude of 5,000 m (16,400 ft.) with a considerable load of weapons and fuel. The helicopter uses radarabsorbing material to lower radar signature and has a significantly crash-proof structure and landing gear. The helicopter is equipped with a countermeasure dispensing system protects it from enemy radars or infrared seekers of enemy missiles.

## **Commercial Updates of Ghana**





The High Commission of India Accra partnered with the Telecom Equipment and Services Export Promotion Council (TEPC) to conduct India-Africa ICT Expo 2022 from the 14-15 September 2022 at Kempinski hotel.

Present at the event were the High Commissioner of India, Deputy Minister of Trade, Director General of TEPC, Vice President of Norden Communication, and Director of Department of Telecommunications, Ministry of Communications. Other speakers at the event were from GIPC, and GEPA.

At the Expo various tech and other companies showcased their goods and services. Some present include MTN, IPMC, Power City Network, Prayaag Technologies, Inextrix Technologies, Peoplelink, Hudusoft, etc

During his speech, Mr. Sugandh Rajaram, High Commissioner of India to Ghana thanked the TEPC for its reengagement of the event. He also emphasized on the opportunities for synergies and partnerships in the tech sector and to deepen efforts in these post pandemic times.

# Local textile factories face collapse



The influx of pirated fabrics on the local market, high cost of production and weak enforcement of anti-piracy measures are threatening the survival of the country's remaining textile companies. The Akosombo Textiles Limited (ATL), Text Styles Ghana Ltd, formerly known as Ghana Textile Print (GTP), Volta Star Textile Limited and Printext are the main companies that survived the turbulence of a dwindling textile sub-sector but they are suffocating as a result of these triple challenges. Ghana once had a vibrant textile industry with 16 large companies that employed some 25,000 people and accounted for 27% of total manufacturing but the industry has deteriorated that by 2005, many of the textile companies folded up with the four major existing ones - GTMC, ATL, GTP and Printext - engaging a mere 2,961 workers.



### PM-YUVA 2.0

In view of the significant impact of the first edition of PM-YUVA Scheme with scale large participation of young and budding authors in 22 Indian languages and English, PM-YUVA 2.0 was launched on 2nd October 2022. The Theme of PM-YUVA 2.0 is Democracy (Institutions, Events, People and Values). Constitutional scheme will help to develop a stream of writers who can write on various facets of Democracy in India encompassing the past, present and future. Besides, the scheme will also provide a window to the aspiring youth to articulate themselves and present a comprehensive outlook of Indian democratic values domestic as well as international platforms. The National Book Trust, India (under BP Division, Ministry of Education, Government of India) as the implementing Agency will ensure phase-wise execution of the Scheme under well-defined stages of mentorship.

Under the scheme total of 75 authors will be selected through an All-India contest to conducted through www.mygov.in from 2 October -3 November 2022. The winners will be announced on 28 February 2023. The young authors will be trained by eminent authors/mentors from 1 March -31 August 2023. Under the mentorship, the first set of published books will be launched on 2nd October 2023.

# **Commercial Updates**



**Kumasi to get electric light rail transportation system**: The first electric light rail transportation (also known a Tram System) will be launched in Kumasi, capital of Ashanti Region. The project will be fully financed by the Czech Government at a total cost of €180 million. A consortium of seven companies from the Czech Republic, led by Knights A.S., will begin work next month for the tram system which would operate three main lines aimed at decongesting the city of Kumasi and pave way for easy flow of traffic

## **Decommissioning of Saltpond Oil Field**



Ghana's first ever oilfield infrastructure decommissioning works has begun at the Saltpond Oil Field at Hini in the Central Region. The decommissioning vessel from Nigeria arrived on 24 September started the decommissioning exercise for permanently shutting the wells because the oilfield, also called Mr Louie, outlived its economic life. Production was stopped in 2015 after the field exhausted its reserves to a low of 200 barrels a day and was unable to meet operational cost, thus becoming unprofitable.

## Architecture

Amba Vilas Palace, or Mysore Palace, is the most popular attraction of the city of Mysore (also called The City of Palaces) in Karnataka State. This regal palace marks architectural brilliance and this becomes apparent right after the first glimpse. The palace is official residence of Mysore's royal family, Wodeyars; who ruled over Mysore between 1350 and 1950. Most parts of the structure are under the control of Karnataka State Government. After Taj Mahal of Agra, Amba Vilas Palace is the most visited tourist spot of India.

The palace was built in 1912 to replace the original palace that made of wood in 1897. The original palace caught fire during royal wedding of princes. Today, it is counted as one among the largest and grandest forts of India.



# Indian Musical Instrument



Sitar is one of the most common and widely used Indian musical instruments. It is prevalent mostly in North India. The instrument is gourd-shaped at the bottom which acts as the resonator supported by a long neck. The neck consists of 7 cords, 20 metal frets, and 13 strings below the frets. The frets are leveraged to adjust the musical notes whereas the sympathetic strings are used to tune the notes.

State of Jharkhand in India takes great pride in Til Barfi as one of its most scrumptious and nutritive delicacies.

## **INGREDIENTS**



1 Cup Sesame Seeds
1 Cup Jaggery
3/4 Cup
Khoya/Mawa
2 tsp Ghee /Clarified
butter
2-3 tsp Water
Chopped nuts for
garnishing

## Method

Start with roasting the sesame seeds. Place the pan on a flame to heat and then add sesame seeds to it. Keep stirring until the seeds are slightly roasted and there is change in color. It takes 2 to 3 minutes to roast the sesame seeds. If the sesame seeds are over roasted, they can turn bitter in taste. When the seeds turn puffy, transfer them to a plate. After sauteing the sesame seeds, add 1 tsp Ghee in the pan and let it melt. Once the ghee melts, add the Khoya/Mawa and sauté till it appears to be of a uniform consistency and looks slightly fried. Transfer roasted Khoya in another plate. Melt remaining desi ghee in same pan. Then melt jaggery, add 2-3 tsp water. Boil jaggery till it forms a syrup. Cook till the syrup starts to bubble. At this stage add in Khoya, mix it well. Then, add roasted sesame seeds and combine everything well till it becomes solid mass. To set the burfi, grease a plate or a tray with some ghee. Now transfer the burfi mixture to set. Sprinkle finely chopped nuts over the burfi to garnish. Allow to set for 30 minutes or until firm. Cut into desired shape and store in airtight container. Tempting and super delicious Til burfi is ready.
