



Prime Minister of India had announced on Independence Day of India that 75 Vande Bharat trains be launched to connect different parts of the country. Vande Bharat, also known as Train 18, can run up to a maximum speed of 160 kmph. All coaches are equipped with automatic doors, GPS based passenger information system, hotspot wifi and very comfortable Regenerative seating. braking system in the coaches help save up to 30% of electrical energy. The train is manufactured in Integral Coach Factory, Chennai.

Samridh Scheme

Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana 2021

Aajeevika - National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) was launched by the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD), Government of India in June 2011.

Aided through in part investment support by the World Bank, the Mission aims at creating efficient and effective institutional platforms of the rural poor, enabling them to increase household income through livelihood sustainable enhancements and improved access to financial services.

NRLM set out with an agenda to cover 7 Crore rural poor households, across 600 districts, 6000 blocks, 2.5 lakh Gram Panchayats and 6 lakh villages in the country through self-managed Self Help Groups (SHGs) and federated institutions and support them for livelihoods collectives in a period of 8-10 years.

In addition, the poor would be facilitated to achieve increased access to rights, public entitlements and services, diversified risk and better social indicators of empowerment. DAY-NRLM believes in harnessing the innate capabilities of the poor and complements them with capacities (information, knowledge, skills, tools, finance and collectivization) to participate in the growing economy of the country.

In November 2015, the program was renamed Deendayal Antayodaya Yojana (DAY-NRLM)

Ramappa Temple and Dholavira – UNESCO Heritage

Two landmark decisions were taken during the 44th session of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee in Fuzhou, with China. the inscriptions of the Rudreshwara Kakatiya (Ramappa) Temple, Telangana and Dholavira: A Harrapan City, Gujarat on the UNESCO World Heritage List.

Kakatiya Rudreshwara (Ramappa) Temple received its inscription as a World Heritage Site on 25 July and Dholavira: A Harrapan City was inscribed on the World Heritage List today, XX July, bringing India's number of World Heritage sites to 40.

Architecture

The Sun Temple is a Hindu temple dedicated to the solar deity Surya located at Modhera village of Mehsana district, Gujarat, India. It is situated on the bank of the river Pushpavati. It was built after 1026-27 CE during the reign of Bhimadev solnki I of the Chaulukya dynasty. The temple complex has three components: Gudhamandapa, the shrine hall; Sabhamandapa, the assembly hall and Kunda, the reservoir.

Dance

The origin of Manipuri dance can be traced back to ancient times that go beyond recorded history. The dance in Manipur is associated with rituals and traditional festivals, there are legendary references to the dances of Shiva and Parvati and other gods and goddesses who created the universe. Manipur dance has a large repertoire, however, the most popular forms are the Ras, the Sankirtana and the Thang-Ta.





Avial is a thick coconut based mixed vegetable curry which is prepared on special occasions. It is predominantly prepared in south India, especially in Kerala. It is an essential dish of Sadya (a festive vegetarian feast served on plantain leaf).



Ingredients for Avial

For Coconut Paste

- $\rightarrow 1 \ cup \ coconut \ 1 \ tsp \\ cumin$
- → 4 green chilies
- → water as required

<u>Vegetables</u>

- $\rightarrow \frac{1}{2}$ Potato
- → ½ cup cucumber 5 long beans
- → 10 Tindora
- → 1 Raw Banana
- → 1 Carrot
- \rightarrow ½ cup elephant foot yam/Suran
- → 1 Drumstick
- → Few curry leaves
- → Water and salt to taste

PREPARATION

(i) Peel and cut vegetables lengthwise into 2" pieces long. (ii) Grind coconut, green chili and cumin seeds into a coarsely paste with little water. (iii) In a large pan, cook potatoes with salt, turmeric powder and water and add mixed vegetables. (iv) Keep adding the vegetables to the boiling water per their cooking time. Add vegetables that take longer to cook first and the ones that cook quickly last. (v) Make a small well in the middle of the half-cooked veggies and pour the coconut paste into it. (vi) Cover the pot and cook for 5 mins. (vii) Turn off the flame and add half cup of sour curd. (viii) In case you have added raw mango along with the vegetables, don't add curd. (ix) After the veggies are done, prepare tempering by heating oil. (x) Add mustard seeds, urad dal, dried red chilis. curry leaves asafoetida. (xi) Allow them to splutter. (xii) Pour the tempering onto the Avial and mix well. Serve Avial hot or warm with steamed rice
